Greetings Hillmen,

Happy Holidays! We are nearing the end of the first term and still much is happening on the Hill. Progress reports were distributed to students on November 16, 2012 by their second period teacher. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's teacher and/or counselor. Finals for the Fall Term will be held on Thursday and Friday, December 20 and 21. Periods 1 and 2 are on Thursday and periods 3 and 4 on Friday. Each period is two hours long and school ends at 12:15 pm. Please remember that the library is open from 7 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday and after school tutoring is available in the library on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 3 pm to 4 pm. This tutoring time is staffed with 2 English teachers, a bilingual aide and soon to be math tutor (parent volunteer). Computers are also available to students during this time. Teachers also offer their time before school, during lunch, and after school, for students requesting help. Please encourage your child to seek out their teacher and establish a time they could meet for extra help.

Freshmen Parents: Does the idea of your student participating in more challenging critical thinking and reading sound rewarding? Would your student benefit from being prepared to tackle AP classes as an upperclassman? Sophomore Accelerated English may be the right choice for your student. Testing to be eligible for Placer's Sophomore Accelerated English class is on Monday, January 14th at 1:45pm or Thursday, January 17th at 6:00pm in the library. There is no need to pre-register. Sophomore and Junior Parents: The English Department is offering testing to enroll in their AP Junior and Senior English classes. If you are currently not enrolled in an AP class, but would like to do so, please have your student attend one of our testing dates this January, either the Monday, the 14th at 1:45 pm or Thursday, the 17th at 6:00 pm. Students must take the test to be enrolled in the program, and students need only attend one of these dates. There is no need to pre-register. Thank you to everyone who helped with the Grad Night Holiday Boutique and Festival of Lights Parade. We appreciate the parents and customers who took the time to visit and spend their dollars for such a good cause.

We encourage you to attend at least one of the next Grad Night meetings- Tuesday December 11th or Tuesday, January 8th 6:30 at Tango. The donation letters will be distributed in January to take to local businesses. We have found the personal face to face contact produces great results and it saves on postage expense.

Do you have unused electronics sitting around your house or are you expecting something new for the holidays to replace your old equipment? If so, save your items and contribute the Grad Night E-Waste collection.

Our next fundraiser is the E-Waste collection scheduled for **Saturday, February 2, 2013** 9:00am - 1:00pm in the PHS lower parking lot. Acceptable electronic items for collection include: monitors, TVs, desktops, laptops, tablets, VCRs, stereos, speakers, keyboards, mice, PDAs, digital cameras, zip drives, telephone, video game consoles, printers, copiers, laser and multi-functional peripherals, scanners, fax machines, small kitchen appliances like blenders, mixers, toasters, microwaves and hairdryers. Non-acceptable items include: household appliances (i.e. refrigerators, washers, and dryers), furniture, hazardous household waste including fluorescent light bulbs, household batteries, car batteries, paint, pesticides, used oil, cleaning supplies and tires.

Electronic items with glass require identification so tape a piece of paper to the item with your name and address.

A pre-collection is scheduled for Saturday, January 12, 2013 9:00am - 12:00pm in the Vintage Oak residential neighborhood. We need 6 volunteers to help in this effort. We will need to pick up E-Waste at shed above the football field at 8:00 (take existing materials out of the dumpster and put into our trailer, and then drive to Vintage Oak area by 9:00). If you have a truck and would like to help with pickup, we could use your help. We also need volunteers to help load from curb to truck. E-waste, unless prearranged, should be left on the curb for pick up. Flyers will be distributed to the Vintage Oak neighborhood during holidays.

We also need at least six volunteers for actual E-Waste event on February 2nd. Both of these events require a good bit of moving and lifting, so be prepared to get a work out. Please contact Lynn Gaffney at 916-532-2761 or

Counseling News...

Financial Aid Night Learn how to help pay for college through scholarships, grants, loans and work study December 4th at 6:30 pm in the Placer High auditorium. The presentation by the Placer High counselors will include information about Cal Grants and tips for filling out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This information will be helpful to anyone planning to attend a 2 or 4 year college or trade/technical school. Students and parents are invited.

College Scholarships and Financial Aid The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the Financial Aid Form to apply for federal, state and specific college campus-based financial aid. This includes grants (free money) and loans (parent and/or student loans that must be paid back). The form consists primarily of financial information that must be filled out by parents and students. The application is done online at www.fafsa.ed.gov and is available for the 2013-2014 academic school year beginning January 1st. Since funds are limited at many colleges, early submission of the FAFSA can maximize chances of receiving financial aid. The FAFSA should be completed no later than March 1 but again the earlier the better.

Cal Grants The State of California funds the Cal Grant program which can be used at colleges and universities in the state. This is "free money" that does not need to be paid back. In order to apply for a Cal Grant, a FAFSA must be filled out and GPA verification must be sent by the high school. This year we are submitting student information including the GPA verification to the Cal Grant program for all of our seniors. If you do not want your student's information sent and wish to opt-out of the Cal Grant program go to the Placer High website, then to the counseling page and select the CalGrant Opt-out on the left side. It will be active until December 6. Keep in mind that if the information is not sent, the student will not be eligible to receive a Cal Grant.

Spring Term Class Changes: Students wanting to make a class change for the spring term should plan to see their counselor before school, at lunch or after school on December 17th, 18th and 19th. Options for available electives are extremely limited and therefore not all change requests will be possible. **Once the spring term begins, students will not be able to make any further class changes except for going into a T.A. position or seniors taking an unscheduled 1st or 4th Period.**

There are a few ROP courses that are offered on a semester basis and will accept new students spring semester. Junior and senior students are eligible to enroll and should see their counselor right away if interested.

Sierra College is offering a Parent Information Night on December 12th. This informative meeting will be held in the Learning Resource Center Room 212 at the Sierra College campus in Rocklin 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Space is limited, so sign up by e-mail at: outreach@sierracollege.edu. **There will also be two Sierra College presentations at PHS for students during the school day:** Wednesday, January 30th 8:15-9:00am and Monday, February 4th 1:45 - 2:00pm. Students should sign up with Ms. Smith in the counseling office.

The online application process for Sierra College will begin in January. See "Applying to Sierra College" on the Placer High website counseling page for the step-by-step process. All students who think they may attend Sierra (even students who are applying to 4-year colleges) should apply online in January. That will leave enough time for students to take care of assessments, orientation and meet with a Sierra counselor before selecting classes. Placer High has reserved assessment times at Sierra College for Wednesday, February 20th (during the week off) at 10:00 am and Monday, March 11th at 2:30 pm (PHS is out at 1:35 for PLC). Students must have already applied online, received their MySierra account and have called the Assessment Office to confirm they want a spot on either of these days. Students who wait will find it's hard to make the necessary appointments needed before registering for classes.

Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors Registration for 2013-14 Classes Timeline:

- AP/Accelerated English Assessment January 14 at 1:45pm or January 17 at 6:00pm in the library.
- Tuesday, February 26th current 9th - 11th grade student will receive the 2013-14 course selection sheets. The course catalog (course descriptions and information) will be available on the school website.
- Thursday, February 28th is Course Preview Day, where student can attend class presentations and talk to teachers about prospective courses including ROP.
- March 2 - 10 students will register for classes online through the parent portal
- March 11 - 19 students will be called in to meet with a counselor to go over course selections.

Sierra College.....

Spring 2013 admission: New students interested in attending Sierra have hopefully already applied to the college as we will be opening up new students registration for classes on December 10, 2012.

Fall 2013 admission: Students will be able to complete the online application for the Fall 2013 semester starting from January 7, 2013. I would recommend that they complete their assessment and counseling appointments no later than March. New students will be able to register in classes from May 8, 2013 for Fall 2013.

Waitlists coming in 2013: Starting in the summer of 2013 the college will introduce an official waitlist for classes. Once a class becomes full a student will be able to enroll on a waitlist for that class. If a space then opens in that class, before the semester starts, the student will be notified by email and will have 48 hours to register and take advantage of that open space.

Associate Degrees for Transfer (AA-T): Please visit the Sierra College web site and find our complete degree and certificate listing for 2012-13. We have include all the AA-T degrees that we are currently offering. The main aim of these degrees are to simplify transfer from a community college into the CSU system.
