As always, much is happening on the Hill as we begin our journey into the last nine weeks of the school year. By now you should have received your child's second progress report for the Spring Term. Now we all get to gear up for the Smarter Balanced test, also known as SBAC, which will be administered the week of April 25. Juniors are the only class that will be testing this week and testing will take place in the lower gym. All other classes will be following a normal school day schedule. There will be no late start this time. All sophomores will take the state required Life Science test on Thursday, April 6. On this day, Freshmen, Juniors and Seniors will late start at 10:00 am. Placer Spring sports have been enjoying a productive and busy preseason, with Baseball, Boys Golf, Boys Volleyball, Girls Soccer, Softball, Swimming, Tennis and Track all off and running. Swimming is coming on strong this year under 4th year head Coach Lisa Huerta with nearly 50 athletes competing this year. Softball again will be looking to battle Bear River for a title and boys volleyball will continue with their title and playoff hopes under coach Andy Klem. Counseling News for April 2016

This is Scholarship Season for our Seniors! There are still some scholarships available this month for seniors to apply. Check the District Scholarship Bulletin on the Placer High Counseling webpage. Do not delay and possibly miss a scholarship opportunity. If you have any questions, please contact Counselor, Katy Chamberlin.

Senior Scholarship Award Night will be held on Wednesday, May 18th at 6:30 pm in the auditorium. This event celebrates seniors who have received school, community, and college scholarships; this is for monetary awards. To assist us in recognizing these accomplishments, we ask that seniors bring copies of their scholarship letters/print-out of email as soon as they get them to the counseling office, so we can include them in the event's program. This includes any college specific awards that students have received, i.e. a Merit Award or Honor Award. The deadline for submissions is Monday, May 4th; this is so you can be recognized before your parents and peers.

College Acceptance: Now is the time when seniors receive college acceptance letters. As you are notified of acceptance be sure to let us know by filling out a college acceptance form at Mrs. Smith's counter in the Counseling Office. With this information, students can be added to our College Board in the counseling office and on the counseling website. With this display, we can all share in the pride of having our students go on to attend some of the best colleges and universities in the country!

Sierra College: Seniors who plan on attending Sierra College next fall should have already applied, completed the online orientation, taken their assessment tests and met with a Sierra counselor. If you have not applied, go to the Placer High website, click on "Counseling" and then click on "Applying to Sierra College" (on the left-hand side under Navigation). The first day of online class selection for new students is April 26, but all of the above mentioned steps must be completed first! Assessment times and counseling appointments are filling up so don't wait! The high demand classes fill up very quickly!

UC Personal Statement--Class of 2017 and After

The University of California is changing the Personal Statement for the future. Students will respond to 4 of the 8 questions and each response limited to 350 words.

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.**
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.**
- 3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?**
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.**
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?**
- 6. Describe your favorite academic subject and explain how it has influenced you.**
- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?**
- 8. What is the one thing that you think sets you**

Testing Dates-SAT & ACT

College-bound Juniors Students who plan on attending a four-year college upon graduation from Placer High School should take the SAT or ACT at this time. See the schedules below. It is highly recommended that all testing be completed by June and perhaps a 2nd test be taken in the Fall. Subject tests are no longer required for the UC system unless specified for an impacted major. For private and out-of-state colleges, check out their requirements and dates online.

Life Science Testing

Dear Parent/Guardian:

To prepare California students for future success, state testing is focused on college and career readiness. The California Assessment of Student Performance & Progress (CAASPP) will be a significant tool to measure student progress.

CAASPP will provide information that can be used to monitor student progress and ensure that all students leave high school ready for college and career. Most notably, your child, come their junior year, will experience computer-adaptive tests. However, this year your child will take a paper and pencil test for life science, as have 10th graders in year's past.

On September 4, 2013, the State Board of Education adopted the *Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) for California Public Schools, Kindergarten through Grade Twelve as required by California Education Code Section 60605.85. The California Department of Education is developing assessments based on the NGSS, and we fully expect these to be computer-based as those currently designed for English-language arts and mathematics.*

During the transition to new science assessments, the 2015–16 CAASPP system encompasses federally required science assessments in grades 5, 8, and 10 (i.e., California Standards Tests [CSTs], California Modified Assessment [CMA], and California Alternate Performance Assessment [CAPA]). Information is provided about the content, types of questions, participation criteria, and other key targeted resources to assist with understanding the scope and requirements of these science assessments at <http://www.cde.ca.gov/ta/tg/ca/caasppscience.asp>.

Grade 10 students will take the Life Science test on **April 6, 2016**.

SBAC Parent Notification Letter

February 17, 2016

Dear Parent/Guardian:

As we move into spring, we are nearing the time when students will participate in the annual state tests.

Teachers at Placer High School are helping students prepare by presenting information in support of these efforts. We are using challenging tasks that require students to provide reasoning, support arguments with evidence, and persevere in solving problems. These are the skills that colleges and employers say our students need to succeed.

The next step is measuring our progress by participating in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). These statewide tests for students in grades 3-8 and grade 11 are an academic check-up in English language arts/literacy and mathematics. These tests will provide information to help improve teaching practices and target learning. Administration of the exams to grade eleven students will be on **April 26, 27, 28, 2016**. Some highlights of the exams include:

- **Computer Based:** Some questions are interactive, and a greater variety of supporting tools can be provided to eligible students, such as magnification of text, and text-to-speech read-aloud of questions.
- **Computer Adaptive:** Students receive test questions that help pinpoint what they know and can do. A correct answer is followed by a more difficult question, and an incorrect answer is followed by an easier question. This provides a more precise estimate of student understanding.
- **Realistic Context for Tasks:** Knowledge is assessed in context—for example, students are asked to select a word of the same meaning to replace a word in a paragraph, rather than to choose a synonym for a word standing alone. In addition, students will need to provide open-ended answers for some questions, rather than selecting from multiple options, and will be asked to write short essays that will need to be scored by hand.
- **No Time Limits:** Students can take the time they need to do their best.

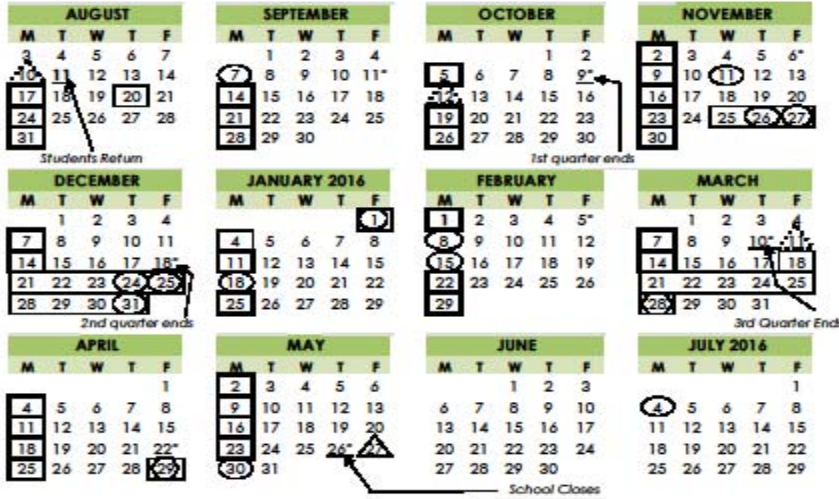
