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Message from the Principal

Greetings Hillmen,

Happy Holidays! We are nearing the end of the first term and still much is happening on the Hill. Progress reports were distributed to students on November 15, 2013 by their second period teacher. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's teacher and/or counselor. Finals for the Fall Term will be held on Thursday and Friday, December 19 and 20. Periods 1 and 2 are on Thursday and periods 3 and 4 on Friday. Each period is two hours long and school ends at 12:15 pm. Please remember that the library is open from 7 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday and after school tutoring is available in the library on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 3 pm to 4 pm. This tutoring time is staffed with 2 English teachers, a bilingual aide and soon two math tutors. Computers are also available to students during this time. Teachers also offer their time before school, during lunch, and after school, for students requesting help. Please encourage your child to seek out their teacher and establish a time they could meet for extra help.

The Placer Drama department just completed their Fall production of Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Nights Dream." Congratulations to a job well done to all performers and their director, drama teacher Josh Green with help from past Drama pro Jason Long. The Placer High Music Department has been busy as well this Fall, putting on great halftime shows at home football games and participating in the Veterans Parade. They wrap up the term with a Winter Concert in the school auditorium on Wednesday, December 11. And don't forget, if you are looking for a Christmas tree, the Band Boosters is selling a great selection in the school parking lot. As we head in to Winter sports, we congratulate all Fall sport athletes and their tremendous success this year. Placer captured five out of six PVL titles and the Boys Cross country team is heading to state finals, along with Grace Schoenhoff representing the girls team. Winter sports is getting under way with girls and boys basketball busy with numerous tournaments, including the Coach G Memorial Tournament and the Kendall Arnett Tournament. Counseling News

Financial Aid Night Learn how to help pay for college through scholarships, grants, loans and work study December 2nd at 6:00 pm in the Placer High auditorium. The presentation by the Placer High counselors will include information about Cal Grants and tips for filling out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This information will be helpful to anyone planning to attend a 2 or 4 year college or trade/technical school. Students and parents are invited.

College Scholarships and Financial Aid The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the Financial Aid Form to apply for federal, state and specific college campus-based financial aid. This includes grants (free money) and loans (parent and/or student loans that must be paid back). The form consists primarily of financial information that must be filled out by parents and students. The application is done online at www.fafsa.ed.gov and is available for the 2014-2015 academic school year beginning January 1st. Since funds are limited at many colleges, early submission of the FAFSA can maximize chances of receiving financial aid. The FAFSA should be completed no later than March 1 but again the earlier the better.

Cal Grants The State of California funds the Cal Grant program which can be used at colleges and universities in the state. This is “free money” that does not need to be paid back. In order to apply for a Cal Grant, a FAFSA must be filled out and GPA verification must be sent by the high school. This year we are submitting student information including the GPA verification to the Cal Grant program for all of our seniors. If you do not want your student’s information sent and wish to opt-out of the Cal Grant program go to the Placer High website, then to the counseling page and select the CalGrant Opt-out on the left side. It will be active until December 9. Keep in mind that if the information is not sent, the student will not be eligible to receive a Cal Grant.

Spring Term Class Changes: Students wanting to make a class change for the spring term should fill out a Course Change Request Form in the Counseling Office as soon as possible. Options for available classes are extremely limited and therefore not all change requests will be possible. **All requests for class changes must be turned in by Friday, December 13th. Once the spring term begins, students will not be able to make any further class changes except for going into a T.A. position or seniors taking an unscheduled 1st or 4th Period.**

The online application process for Sierra College will begin in January. See “Applying to Sierra College” on the Placer High website counseling page for the step-by-step process. All students who think they may attend Sierra (even students who are applying to 4-year colleges) should apply online in January. Applying in January will leave enough time for students to take care of assessments, orientation and meet with a Sierra counselor before selecting classes. We have been told that Placer High School will be able to administer the Sierra College Placement Tests this spring. More information will be coming as soon as we know the procedures for this testing. What we do know is that students must have already applied online and received their MySierra account in order to take the assessments. Students are urged to start the process early since counseling appointments at Sierra fill up quickly.



Counseling News Continued.....

Spring is the time Juniors should take College Admission Tests. Juniors who plan on attending a 4-year college immediately upon graduation from PHS need to take the SAT and/or the ACT. The tests can be taken multiple times and colleges will use the best scores for admission. See the schedule below, just go to the websites and register.

Cultural Homestay International, a nonprofit educational exchange organization & Placer ASB students are co-sponsoring a group of Japanese high school students (boys and girls,) for a homestay from **3/11-3/25/2014**. The students are here to experience American school life and to see what it's like to be a member of an American family. During the 15 day visit, the Japanese students will be observing classes, having cultural exchanges on Placer's campus and becoming familiar with our community. Families interested in hosting a student will receive:

- Application, letter and photos of their student.
- Orientation prior to their student's arrival
- On going support during the visit.

Host Family responsibilities:

Provide a bed (students may share a room with a sibling of the same sex & beds are available if you don't have an extra bed.)

Provide meals while the student is in your home (meals purchased on field trips are the responsibility of the student.)

Make arrangements for the student to be dropped off, on most days, at Placer by 7:55am and picked up at 2:55. (If you are not available to pick your student up until 5 or 6 pm on weekdays, other arrangements can be made.) Weekends are spent with the host family.

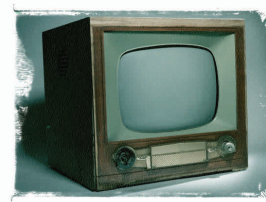
