# Message from the Principal

Greetings Hillmen,

Welcome back!! I hope you found your summer to be fun and relaxing and now you are ready to begin the new year. I wanted to take just a few moments of your time to bring you up to speed with Placer High news and important dates to remember. We are still operating same as last year in regards to bell schedule and PLC Mondays. Hill Friday BBQ's are returning for all home football games, when we have extended lunch during the day where students will be able to purchase a hot dog meal and enjoy some lunchtime activities.

We welcome many new staff members: counselor Karen Garcia, Math teacher Albert Curry, English teacher Stacy Wagner, Ceramics teacher Kelly Baxter, French teacher Andreanne Breton, Spanish teacher Anna Gonzalez-Cifuentes and assistant principal Cris Everett. Attendance procedures will remain the same. Please remember to call in the same day your child is out of school, and if you have a planned early dismissal, please send your child to the office with a note prior to the period they will be missing. Tutoring begins on September 1 and will be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 3 pm to 4 pm in the Library. This is a great time for your child to get some work done and receive help on all subjects, specifically Math, English and Spanish. We had a successful turnout at Back to School Night and I thank all who took time to visit their child's classrooms and teachers.

On Friday, August 24, all students were given the student handbook which outlines academic programs and school policies. Please read through this handbook thoroughly as we have added a few new items, such as new guidelines for sports eligibility (p. 6) and attendance rules for seniors (p. 19). Also, we encourage all families who are eligible to apply for the Free and Reduced lunch program. The application can be found online through the school web site, under the Nutrition Program link, and then Meal Applications link. A hard copy can also be picked up in the registrar's office or cafeteria. Placer High School is a targeted Title One School, which allows us to receive federal funding to help with student achievement. Placer High relies on accurate demographic information to receive this federal funding. These funds are used throughout the year for tutoring programs, along with AVID and EL students to help maintain a level of success.

As always, the staff at Placer High continually strives to create a learning environment where all students can succeed. For the last several years we have been asking ourselves:

What do you want students to learn, how do we know they are learning it, and what do we do when they do or do not learn it?

For this year, we continue with the questions we added last year and place more emphasis on the student:

What do I need to learn, How do I get there, Where do I go next?

You may remember we held various community forums at the high school sites and with the help of community members, parents, students and staff, a strategic plan was developed throughout the District. From this plan arose three pillars of academic success that all schools want for their students.

Welcome back to Placer High School, Home of the Hillmen! A special welcome to the new Freshmen Class of 2019! The counseling caseload is divided alphabetically as follows:

Katy Chamberlin, Counselor "A-G" Dave Ward, Counselor "H-M" Karen Garcia, Counselor "N-Z"

<u>Senior Guidance</u>: At the beginning of the year, our counselors verify that each senior is in the required classes for graduation and meet with those students who need Adult School for additional credits. Parents can check their student's graduation and credit status through the Parent Portal. In September, counselors visit all senior level classes to review transcripts with students and talk about how to get ready for their plans after high school. Since most of our students are going to college, both 4 year and community college applications will be discussed. Paying for college is another hot topic, so the process for applying for scholarships and financial aid is outlined as well.

<u>Four Year Planning for 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> Grade</u>: This fall the Counselors will meet with all 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students to create or adjust their personal Four-year Plan. They will also meet with half of the 9<sup>th</sup> grade students in their Tech Essentials this term and the rest next term. This is designed to assist students in determining what courses to take, what sequence should be followed, what classes are required to be college eligible, and to help plan for goals after graduating from high school.

<u>Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT):</u> The PSAT is a "practice" SAT test as well as the qualification exam for the National Merit Scholarship competition. It is primarily designed for juniors. Sophomores may also take the PSAT, but they are not qualified for the NMSQ competition until their junior year. The test will be given at Placer High School on Wednesday, October 14<sup>th</sup> 7:45 – 11:00 am in the lower gym. This is a regular school day and students will miss Periods 1 and 2. Registration will be open September 8 – October 7. There is a limited number of tests that are ordered so interested students should sign up as soon as the registration window opens. There is no guarantee that there will be enough tests for students who wait until later in the registration period. The fee for the test is \$18.00 payable in cash or a check to Placer High School. Fee waivers are available for juniors on Free or Reduced Lunch. Please sign up with Mrs. Smith in the counseling office.

College Application Deadlines: Seniors applying to either CSU or UC campuses must submit their completed applications online by November 30<sup>th</sup>! Online applications are available beginning October 1<sup>st</sup> for both the CSU and UC systems. CSU applications can be submitted online October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. (csumentor.edu) Even though the UC application window opens on October 1<sup>st</sup> completed applications can only be submitted November 1<sup>st</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup>. Since the UC applications are very detailed and include a personal statement, we suggest that students start as early as possible. (universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/how-to-apply/) Seniors applying to private universities and colleges should verify the specific registration deadlines by contacting the individual college or university. Students who plan on attending Sierra College should apply beginning in January, 2016. Seniors should keep their transcript they received during their grad status meeting in September so they can accurately report their classes and grades on their college application.

<u>College Information Night Open to all grade levels!</u> Placer High will host our district wide college information night on Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup>. Representatives from a few colleges and universities will be there to present, hand out information and answer questions. The event will take place from 6:00p.m. – 8:00p.m. Students and parents from all the high schools in our district are invited to attend. Another College Fair is being hosted Oct. 8th at Rocklin High with nearly 100 college booths available for parent/student visits with representatives. Reserve the night; more to follow in our October Newsletter.

<u>Scholarships:</u> A District Scholarship web site is available by accessing the Placer Counseling web page. (<a href="https://sites.google.com/a/puhsd.k12.ca.us/placer-counseling-department/">https://sites.google.com/a/puhsd.k12.ca.us/placer-counseling-department/</a>) Scholarships are posted by all sites and specify qualifications, amounts, deadlines, etc. There are a few fall local scholarships, but the true season is Jan.-April. Please check it weekly for updates. There are a number of National websites as well which we encourage parents and teachers to Google since the District site tends to focus on local & state scholarships.

<u>Parent Portal</u>: We strongly encourage you to use the <u>Parent Portal</u> to access your student's grades, assignments and attendance. If you have any questions on how to access this valuable tool, please contact the counseling secretary Lisa Smith at <u>lismith@puhsd.k12.ca.us</u> In addition to the Parent Portal, we urge you to check the Placer High website at www.puhsd.k12.ca.us/placer/ Here you will find the daily bulletins, information about upcoming events, class information, teacher contacts and so much more. The counseling page includes information about colleges, scholarships, financial aid, ROP programs and more.

<u>Free/Reduced Lunch Program:</u> We encourage all students who qualify financially to register for the Free/Reduced Lunch Program. In addition to helping students afford lunch; this program qualifies students for other need based programs such as fee waivers for ACT tests, SAT tests, AP tests and college application costs. Students must re-apply for this program each year as last year's eligibility will expire on September 22, 2015.

<u>Work Permits:</u> All work permits expired on August 30, 2015. Please see Mrs. Smith in the counseling office if you need to renew your work permit. You may pick up an application before or after school only. Once you have returned your completed application, it takes 24 hours to process and may be picked up at the end of the school day.

#### **Tutoring Reminder**

Placer High's after school tutoring will begin September 8th! Students are invited after school from 3-4 pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays to the library to study, use the computer lab, and receive free tutoring from teachers and peer tutors in all subject areas. All students are welcome!

<u>SAT and ACT Tests</u>: Seniors who plan on attending a 4-year college next year must take the SAT or ACT (see your counselor for questions). Deadlines for testing registration are listed on the next page. Don't miss the deadline and pay extra for late registration. All testing must be completed by December, but some schools require tests by November (SDSU, Cal Poly, SJSU and others). Make sure to send test scores to all colleges where you apply. #### FLYER FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES ELEVEN AND TWELVE

#### California High School Proficiency Exam (CHSPE) 2015–16

#### What is the CHSPE?

The California High School Proficiency Examination (CHSPE) is a voluntary test that assesses proficiency in basic reading, writing, and mathematics skills taught in public schools. The CHSPE consists of two test sections: mathematics and English-language arts (ELA). The ELA section has two subtests (reading and language). Eligible persons who pass both parts of the CHSPE are awarded a Certificate of Proficiency by the State Board of Education. The test is given in English only.

#### Who is eligible to take the CHSPE?

You may take the CHSPE only if on the test date, you:

- · are at least 16 years old, or
- have been enrolled in the tenth grade for one academic year or longer, or
- will complete one academic year of enrollment in the tenth grade at the end of the semester during which
  the next regular administration will be conducted. (Regular administrations are the fall and spring
  administrations each school year.)

#### When is the CHSPE offered?

The administration dates for the 2015–16 school year are as follows:

There is at least one test administration center in most California counties; some counties have more than one test administration center. A list of the counties and test centers may be found on the Internet at <a href="http://www.chspe.net/about/locations/">http://www.chspe.net/about/locations/</a> or in the CHSPE Information Bulletin also available on this Web site.

#### **Certificate of Proficiency**

California law requires that the Certificate of Proficiency be equivalent to a high school diploma. Institutions that are subject to California law and that require a high school diploma must accept a Certificate of Proficiency. A student who receives a Certificate of Proficiency may, with verified parental approval, leave high school early. The Certificate of Proficiency, however, is not equivalent to completing all course work required for regular graduation from high school. Speak to your school counselor to understand the benefits of the Certificate of Proficiency. This certificate meets the federal financial aid requirement of a high school diploma or equivalent. If you are planning to continue your studies in a college or university, contact the admissions office so that you may understand its requirements and whether or not the CHSPE certificate will be accepted.


