## Message from the Principal

Greetings Hillmen,

Well, the school year is in full swing, and like always, the Placer campus is full of activity, even with the Homecoming Week already passed. We are nearly at the halfway mark of the first term and students have received their first progress report of the year. Please contact your child's teacher and/or counselor if you have any questions or concerns. Teachers and staff continue their work with PLC's, with every Monday designated again as a PLC (professional learning community) day. During this time teachers are working on the three questions that I have mentioned time and again –

**What do we want them to Learn?,  
How do we know they are learning?, and  
What do we do when they do/don't?**

Now we have added more to this. The students take on their share of responsibility with the questions –

**What do I need to Know?,  
How do I get there?,  
Where next?**

And like everything else in education, we are adding even more. Below are the three goals of our Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). Each goal also comes with six action plans that are tied to our budget so that as the plan describes, accountability lies with spending money on improving student achievement. You can view the one page document on the school web site, under the parents tab – LCAP.

Strengthen Achievement of All Students Including Special Populations  
Provide a Safe, Healthy, and Engaged Learning Environment for All**

The overall focus of this work is to create an environment that allows students to become college, career and life ready. This is also an important time for many Seniors as they begin the journey of completing college applications and all of them continuing with coursework as we look forward to graduation. As we all know, time flies when we are having fun, and before we know it, Winter break will be upon us and the end of the first term. Please take the time to review with your child their four year plan, and reach out to counselors to see if your child is on track to complete the courses that will help them become college, career and life ready.

For the fourth year running, the PASS (Pursuing Academic School Success) program will begin at the first grading period for freshmen who at the end of the first grading period earned 2 or more F's. Designated students will have to attend mandatory tutoring sessions during lunch Tuesday through Thursday until the next grading cycle. These select students will be excused from 3<sup>rd</sup> period class 10 minutes early so as to get lunch and report to assigned classroom. This program is being run strictly by the administrative team, Principal Mr. Efstathiou, and Assistant Principals Kim Barry, Cris Everett and Steve Caminiti. Please note that the library is open for tutoring after school 3 to 4 pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The time is staffed with a teacher and student tutor. This is an opportunity for students to come and get help, have quiet place to study, and use the computers.

## Continued from Our Principal.....

In Athletics, Placer Fall sports teams are in the middle of league play. The girls golf team continues their success on the links, with many new golfers on the team. The cross country team is heading in to league play with several new runners making an impact for the young team. The girls volleyball is looking for another league title, but faces uphill battle with Coflax and Bear River. The boys soccer team is enjoying success and will be looking to make the playoffs again. Football is coming off an impressive pre-season, finishing 5-0, and will look for another PVL title.

Lastly, please remind your students about life "On the Hill" if they happen to venture downtown during lunch time. Our Hillmen should embody pride, responsibility, and character at all times as they represent the school in the community. One of the issues is tending to one's own trash. If every person just picked up their trash, there would be no trash. Thanks for all that you do.

**Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT):** The PSAT is a “practice” SAT test as well as the qualification exam for the National Merit Scholarship competition. It is primarily designed for juniors. Sophomores may also take the PSAT, but they are not qualified for the NMSQ competition until their junior year. The test will be given at Placer High School on Wednesday, October 14<sup>th</sup> 7:45 – 11:00 am in the lower gym. This is a regular school day and students will miss Periods 1 and 2. Registration closes on October 7<sup>th</sup>. There are a limited number of tests left so interested students should sign up today. The fee for the test is \$18.00 payable in cash or a check to Placer High School. Fee waivers are available for juniors on Free or Reduced Lunch. Please sign up with Mrs. Smith in the counseling office.

**Parent Portal:** We strongly encourage you to use the Parent Portal to access your student’s grades, assignments and attendance. Progress Report Grades are now to be accessed through the portal; there will be no more hand carried Grade Reports. If you have any questions on how to access this valuable tool, please contact the counseling secretary Lisa Smith at [lismith@puhsd.k12.ca.us](mailto:lismith@puhsd.k12.ca.us) In addition to the Parent Portal, we urge you to check the Placer High website at [www.puhsd.k12.ca.us/placer/](http://www.puhsd.k12.ca.us/placer/) Here you will find the daily bulletins, information about upcoming events, class information, teacher contacts and so much more. The counseling page includes information about colleges, scholarships, financial aid, ROP programs and more.

**College Information Night: Open to all grade levels!** On Thursday, October 8<sup>th</sup> the Placer Foothill High Schools Consortium will host their annual college night in the Rocklin High School gyms. This event will begin at 6:00pm. Placer High is one out of nine schools to sponsor help sponsor this event. Representatives from approximately 100 colleges and universities will be there to hand out information and answer questions. In addition, breakout sessions will be available throughout the event on topics such as the CSU and UC systems, private colleges, and community colleges, paying for college, the upcoming SAT changes and more. This event is free of charge and open to students and parents from all of the high schools in our district. Students of all grade levels are encouraged to attend. It is never too early to start planning your future!

**4 Year College Application Deadlines:** Seniors applying to either CSU or UC campuses must submit their completed applications online by November 30<sup>th</sup>! Online applications are available beginning October 1<sup>st</sup> for both the CSU and UC systems. CSU applications can be submitted online October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. ([csumentor.edu](http://csumentor.edu)) Even though the UC application window is already open--yes it is open now--completed applications can only be submitted November 1<sup>st</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup>. Since the UC applications are very detailed and include a personal statement, we suggest that students start as early as possible. ([www.universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/how-to-apply/](http://www.universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/how-to-apply/)) Seniors applying to private universities and colleges should verify the specific registration deadlines by contacting the individual college or university. If there are any questions on applications, students should consult their counselor before they hit submit, but please do so in a timely manner before mid-November. Seniors should keep their transcript they received during their grad status meeting in September so they can accurately report their classes and grades on their college application.

**Sierra College Applying for Fall 2016 Semester:** Students can now start applying for admission to the college for Fall 2016. This is much earlier than previous years and allows us more time to assist students with the enrollment process. The online admission application is on the website at <http://www.sierracollege.edu/admissions/future-student/new-student.php>

**Placement and Assessment:** An online placement tool has been developed as a resource to help determine if an incoming student to Sierra College are required to take the college placement exam. Both the application steps and the placement tool can be found through Placer's Counseling Webpage along the left side-bar. Class Registration is not until April.

**Placer High Scholarship and Financial Aid Night:** Parents and students are invited to come and learn the basics about student financial aid for post-secondary education (4- Year College, community college, trade/tech/vocational colleges). The presentation will be Monday, December 1<sup>st</sup> 6:30pm in the Placer High auditorium. Reminder: Always check our District Scholarship Bulletin (found on the Placer High counseling webpage) for new scholarship opportunities.

**EAP Scores for our Seniors:** EAP Test results that were mailed home for our seniors had a section on the lower left of the backside entitled Early Assessment Program (EAP). Listed there is an English Status and a Mathematics Status. This information is used by the California State University System and some California Community Colleges to determine college readiness. Explanation of the statuses can be found at [www.collegeEAP.org](http://www.collegeEAP.org) If you need more information contact our counselors.

**Junior and Senior Transcript Review:** During September, counselors met with all the juniors and seniors to go over their graduation status. In addition to your student receiving a transcript, these meetings included a transcript review, credit verification, establishing a plan for class or credit deficiencies, career exploration and college issues such as applications, scholarships and financial aid.

**Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)** This free test will be administered at Placer High School on Monday, November 9<sup>th</sup> at 1:40pm (PLC Minimum Day) in the Career Center. This is open to 10<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grade students. Though the ASVAB is designed by the military to gauge the aptitude of prospective recruits, its results provide a wealth of career information even if the military is not the ultimate goal. Sign-ups will begin Monday, October 19<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, November 5<sup>th</sup>. See Mrs. Smith in the Counseling Office.

**Four-Year Planning:** During October and November the counselors will meet with all sophomores and approximately half of the freshmen (the other half in January) to review graduation requirements, explain college requirements and update their 4-year high school plan.

**California High School Exit Examination:** All seniors and juniors who have not yet passed this exam will be tested in November. (English Language Arts on Nov. 4 and Mathematics on Nov. 5). The status of CAHSEE as a graduation requirement is still enforced though the CA government is considering cancelling it; Placer will continue to prep students and administer tests as in the past until otherwise told by government officials to not do so.

**Sierra College Student & Parent Information Meetings:** Learn more about the many academic and career opportunities offered through Sierra College. Meetings are held on the Rocklin campus at 6:00pm in Building D Walker Hall Room 12. Meeting dates are October 1, October 22, November 5, and November 19. Contact Sierra College Outreach office at [outreach@sierracollege.edu](mailto:outreach@sierracollege.edu) to make reservations. Please include your name, number of people and the date of meeting in your e-mail reservation.

**SAT and ACT Tests:** Seniors who plan on attending a 4-year college next year must take the SAT or ACT (see your counselor for questions). Deadlines for testing registration are listed on the next page. Don't miss the deadline and pay extra for late registration. All testing must be completed by December, but some schools require tests by November (SDSU, Cal Poly, SJSU and others). Make sure to send test scores to all colleges where you apply. ## FLYER FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES ELEVEN AND TWELVE

### California High School Proficiency Exam (CHSPE) 2015–16

#### What is the CHSPE?

The California High School Proficiency Examination (CHSPE) is a voluntary test that assesses proficiency in basic reading, writing, and mathematics skills taught in public schools. The CHSPE consists of two test sections: mathematics and English-language arts (ELA). The ELA section has two subtests (reading and language). Eligible persons who pass both parts of the CHSPE are awarded a Certificate of Proficiency by the State Board of Education. The test is given in English only.

#### Who is eligible to take the CHSPE?

You may take the CHSPE *only if* on the test date, you:

- are at least 16 years old, *or*
- have been enrolled in the tenth grade for one academic year or longer, *or*
- will complete one academic year of enrollment in the tenth grade at the end of the semester during which the next regular administration will be conducted. (Regular administrations are the fall and spring administrations each school year.)

#### When is the CHSPE offered?

The administration dates for the 2015–16 school year are as follows:

There is at least one test administration center in most California counties; some counties have more than one test administration center. A list of the counties and test centers may be found on the Internet at <http://www.chspe.net/about/locations/> or in the CHSPE Information Bulletin also available on this Web site.

#### Certificate of Proficiency

California law requires that the Certificate of Proficiency be equivalent to a high school diploma. Institutions that are subject to California law and that require a high school diploma must accept a Certificate of Proficiency. A student who receives a Certificate of Proficiency may, with verified parental approval, leave high school early. The Certificate of Proficiency, however, is not equivalent to completing all course work required for regular graduation from high school. Speak to your school counselor to understand the benefits of the Certificate of Proficiency. This certificate meets the federal financial aid requirement of a high school diploma or equivalent. If you are planning to continue your studies in a college or university, contact the admissions office so that you may understand its requirements and whether or not the CHSPE certificate will be accepted.

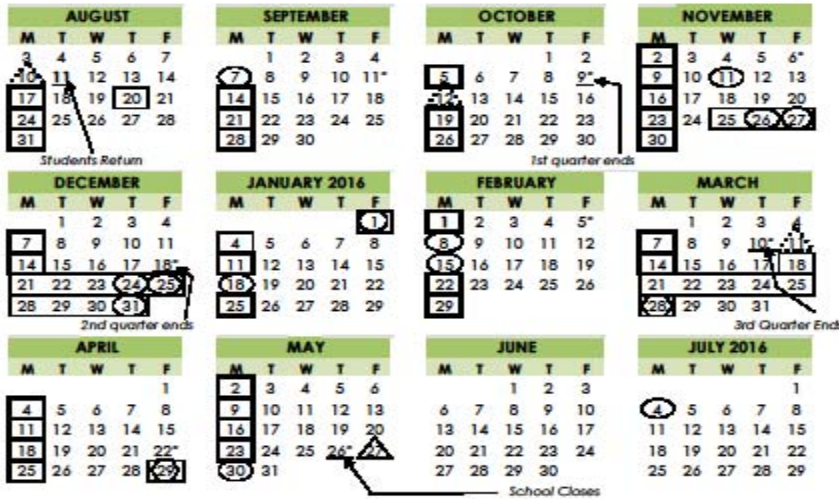
